

Due to track bypass construction at Shibuya Station on Ginza Line Service to be temporarily suspended twice between Shibuya and Omote-sando and between Aoyamaitchome and Tameike-sanno on the Ginza Line • First suspension: All day during two-day period between Saturday, November 5 and Sunday, November 6, 2016 • Second suspension: All day during two-day period between Saturday, November 19 and Sunday, November 20, 2016

Due to track bypass construction to accompany the relocation of Shibuya Station on the Ginza Line, Tokyo Metro (Head Office in: Taito Ward, Tokyo; President: Yoshimitsu Oku) will <u>temporarily</u> <u>suspend service twice between Shibuya and Omote-sando and between Aoyama-itchome and</u> <u>Tameike-sanno on the Ginza Line all day during the following four days in total: the two-day period</u> <u>between Saturday, November 5 and Sunday, November 6, 2016 and the two-day period between</u> <u>Saturday, November 19 and Sunday, November 20, 2016</u>.

On the aforementioned days of construction, <u>shuttle trains will be in service between Omote-sando</u> <u>and Aoyama-itchome and between Tameike-sanno and Asakusa</u>. Moreover, the transfer of passenger ticket or train pass holders for the routes to undergo construction will be facilitated with the use of Tokyo Metro lines, Toei Subway lines, JR lines, and private railway lines.

We apologize for the considerable inconvenience to users of the Ginza Line that this construction will cause. Your understanding and cooperation would be appreciated.

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Partial Temporary Suspension of Service on Ginza Line Due to Track Bypass Construction: Overview

- 1. Days and times when service will be temporarily suspended
- (1) First suspension: From first train to last train on both days between Saturday, November 5 and Sunday, November 6, 2016
 - *Should construction be suspended for various reasons, the above days will be changed to Saturday, November 12 and Sunday, November 13, 2016
- (2) Second suspension: From first train to last train on both days between Saturday, November 19 and Sunday, November 20, 2016

*Should construction be suspended for various reasons, the above days will be changed to Saturday, November 26 and Sunday, November 27, 2016

- 2. Modes of train service on Ginza Line on days of construction
- (1) Routes on which train service is suspended all day
 - Between Shibuya and Omote-sando
 - Between Aoyama-itchome and Tameike-sanno

(2) Shuttle train service routes and intervals

Heading towards direction of Aoyama-itchome: Intervals of approx. 16 to 19 min. from first train to 7:00 AM; intervals of approx. 12 min. from 7:00 AM to midnight; intervals of approx. 17 min. from midnight to last train

Heading towards direction of Omote-sando: Intervals of approx. 16 to 22 min. from first train to 7:00 AM; intervals of approx. 12 min. from 7:00 AM to midnight; intervals of approx. 18 min. from midnight to last train

- Between Tameike-sanno and Asakusa
 - <Shuttle train service intervals>

Heading towards direction of Asakusa: Intervals of approx. 3 to 15 min. from first train to 10:00 AM; intervals of approx. 3 min. from 10:00 AM to 7:00 PM; intervals of approx. 3 to 10 min. from 7:00 PM to last train

Heading towards direction of Tameike-sanno: Intervals of approx. 3 to 14 min. from first train to 10:00 AM; intervals of approx. 3 min. from 10:00 AM to 7:00 PM; intervals of approx. 3 to 10 min. from 7:00 PM to last train



[Relocation construction for Shibuya Station on Ginza Line]

Tokyo Metro is in the process of renovating Shibuya Station on the Ginza Line to coincide with the maintenance of that station's block infrastructure.

The construction to take place involves relocating Shibuya Station from its existing location by approx. 130m towards the direction of Omote-sando, and building a new "Shibuya Station on the Ginza Line" above Meiji-dori (street). The train platform of the new station will be structured so that it is positioned between two tracks, thereby eliminating the distinction between platforms for getting on and getting off the train that had existed until now. Moreover, the width of the train platform will be enlarged to mitigate crowding on the platform, and platform doors will be installed to enhance passenger safety.

[Overview of this construction (bypass construction on tracks between Omote-sando Station and Shibuya Station on Ginza Line)]

As part of construction work to relocate Shibuya Station on the Ginza Line, in order to secure space for building a new train platform, the existing track will be relocated towards the south.

[Regulations on Meiji-dori car lanes to accompany construction]

Between 6:00 AM and 3:00 PM on Saturday, November 5 and Saturday, November 19, regulations on the outer car lanes on Meiji-dori will be regulated to accompany the construction on Shibuya Station. Please note that car lane regulations that conventionally accompany construction (between 10:00 PM and 6:00 AM the following day) will be implemented as normal.

These regulations are expected to cause traffic on Meiji-dori. We apologize for the considerable inconvenience that will result. Your understanding and cooperation would be appreciated.
